3 Steps to Jump-Start Your School Safety Mapping Project



Identify Your Buildings

Identify which buildings need safety maps and note how many floors are within each building.

- Note that many grant/funding rules specify that the buildings to be mapped must be for student use
- Include basement areas as part of your building project specification
- Consider designating a single point of contact as your mapping project coordinator









Locate Your Floor Plans

Accurate floor plan files are the foundation for effective school safety maps. Provide digital files of floor plans that are as "clean" as possible – meaning, they feature clear schematics and are free of extraneous graphic elements. Helpful resources for locating floor plan files include:

- · Facility managers
- · Contracted architects
- Electricians

- HVAC professionals
- Local first responder agencies
- City government
